Georgia's Opioid Settlement & the Role of Participating Local Governments



Opioid Settlement Highlights

- \$638 million to Georgia over 18 years
- State's share is 75% = \$479 million
- 40% of the state's share = \$191.6 million
 - Must be spent on a regional basis
- Governments" are bound by a MOU which State of Georgia and "Participating Local defines the allocation of these funds





- The slate will be approved if a majority of those present vote in favor of it

The Memorandum of Understanding between the State of Georgia and Participating Local Governments as part of Georgia's participation in the national Opioid Distributor and Janssen Settlements requires the creation of the Georgia Opioid Settlement Advisory Commission (GOSAC) and Regional Advisory Councils (RACs) to assess grant applications and recommend funding for the regional portion of the opioid settlement funds. As part of the settlement, Participating Local Governments are required to vote on three GOSAC representatives and the RAC members for their respective regions.

Each Participating Local Government will receive one vote as part of this process. This vote will be held at regional, in-person meetings (see the attached list), and the voting delegate must be present to cast his or her vote on behalf of the Participating Local Government. The slate will be approved if the majority of the voting delegates present vote in favor of it. Additional information on the regional meetings will be emailed to the voting delegates.





If I understand my conversation with Mr. Lark his homestead exemption hasn't shown up on his property tax notifications / assessments or bills since 2009. He just noticed he wasn't receiving it this year. The tax assessor's office has searched his tax records and hasn't found any evidence that his homestead exemption was ever filed for in 2009 and has marked no error on the attached tax release application form. Mr. Lark has attached several documents to his application for tax release, they are also attached.

As instructed at the February 27th meeting, this Issue was investigated by the Chief Appraiser and me. I was looking for any electronic documentation concerning this on the older servers from the Assessor's office. I found no records concerning this through my search of the current and previous server. Most likely if there were any records they would have been on the server in use through the 2008 – 2010 timeframe. That server was compromised by a data breech and turned over to the GBI as evidence in 2010. The Chief Appraiser was unable to secure any hard copy of documents concerning this issue other than information that was presented at the February 27th, meeting.

- (a)(1) An applicant seeking a homestead exemption as provided in Code Section 48-5-44 and qualifying under the provisions of Code Section 48-5-40 shall file a written application and schedule with the tax receiver or tax commissioner charged with the duty of receiving returns of property for taxation at any time during the calendar year subsequent to the property becoming the primary residence of the applicant up to and including the date for the closing of the books for the return of taxes for the calendar year.
- (2) The failure to file properly the application and schedule on or before the date for the

shall constitute a waiver of the homestead exemption on the part of the applicant failing to make the application for such exemption for that year.

- (b) The owner of a homestead which is actually occupied by the owner as a residence and homestead shall not have to apply for the exemption more than once so long as the owner remains in continuous occupation of the residence as a homestead. The exemption shall automatically be renewed from year to year so long as the owner continuously occupies the residence as a homestead.
- (c) It is unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to solicit, either directly or by mail or advertisement, any other person for the purpose of filing on behalf of such other person the application and schedule for homestead exemption required by this Code section if a fee is charged for filing such application and schedule on behalf of such other person. A violation of this subsection shall be a misdemeanor.
