	Revenue had a favorable variance of \$2k primarily due to:

	Unfavorable variance in Medicaid Waivers due to staffing

	Unfavorable variance in Other Local funds for the accounts		
	receivable accrual adjustment of \$18k and reimbursement/non		
	reimbursement contracts net \$14k.

	Comparison of Budget to Actual		
	If we continue to meet budget the projected year-end surplus would be \$2,195k.		
	 Proposed Budget for FY16 Victor Bowers presented the proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2016. The budget is very conservative and is based on what we currently know. The budget has a net surplus of \$322k. A lot of the Grant-in-Aid we receive for core services will be changing to Fee-for-Service January 1st. Infrastructure money of \$500k is going away January 1st. \$150k in startup funds for the new programs we added this year are not in this budget. Reimbursement contracts – we have to spend before we are reimbursed. This budget may change for the better depending on what the state does. Charles Higgs made a motion to accept the proposed budget; second by Joe Hirsch. Motion passed. 		
	 Election of Officers for FY16 Printed ballots were marked, collected and the vote was unanimous. The FY16 officers will affirm their oath of office next month.
