Hart County Board of Commissioners met May 10, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. at the Hart County Administrative & Emergency Services Center.

Chairman Marshall Sayer presided with Commissioners Michael Bennett, Frankie Teasley and Joey Dorsey in attendance. Commissioner Ricky Carter was absent.

1. Prayer

Prayer was offered by Commissioner Dorsey.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Sayer called the meeting to order.

4. Welcome

Chairman Sayer welcomed everyone in attendance; invited former Code Enforcement Randall Graham to come to the front and presented him with a plaque for his years of service with Hart County.

Commissioner Teasley commended law enforcement, first responders, EMS, GSP and everyone that responded to the murder scene yesterday.

Commissioner Dorsey commended Emergency Services, Sheriff, GSP for working together at the crime scene; mentioned the letter to the editor of The Hartwell Sun written by Charlene Fields; he explained the purpose of a Short Term Rental Ordinance is not to penalize anyone; designed to manage growth and the BOC has every right to implement ordinances.

Chairman Sayer commended everyone that responded to the call of duty yesterday.

12. Old Business

a) Short Term Rental Ordinance 2nd Reading

Chairman Sayer invited DNR Officer Brandon Pierce to explain what DNR can or cannot enforce on the lake.

Officer Pierce stated most of the issues with short term rental properties involve alcohol; individuals fail to comply with the 100' rule to reduce speed on the lake of an object; docks are being damaged; DNR has two officers assigned to Hart County; they cannot enforce local ordinances.

Resident from Reed Creek rents out the lower portion of her home on Lake Hartwell voiced concerns with some parts of the proposed Short Term Rental Ordinance.

Charlene Fields questioned who is going to perform the inspections and asked the BOC to consider the 1st time reading of the proposed ordinance.

Commissioner Dorsey moved to accept the 2nd reading of the Short Term Rental Ordinance and schedule 3rd reading June 14, 2022 meeting. Commissioner Bennett provided a second to the motion. The motion carried 4-0.

b) Whitworth Details Discussion

Administrator Partain explained Whitworth Parole Center does not have enough guards to send out crews and a private company is cutting grass at various county facilities.
